



Deborah Lee James Leads SAIC's C4IT Business Unit

(MCLEAN, VA) - Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC) announced today that Deborah Lee James will lead the Command, Control, Communications, Computer and Information Technology (C4IT) Business Unit as senior vice president and general manager. The C4IT Business unit is a \$370 million entity that focuses on systems engineering and integration, software engineering and development, and Web enablement for the military's command and control systems.

James brings more than 20 years of experience to this position from both public and private sectors. Prior to becoming the general manager of the C4IT Business Unit, James served in a variety of senior management and business development assignments during her three years at SAIC.

James was the assistant secretary of defense for Reserve Affairs from 1993-1998. In this capacity, she served as senior advisor to the secretary of defense on all matters pertaining to the 1.8 million National Guard and Reserve personnel worldwide. She also worked extensively with Congress, state governors, industry, military associations and international officials on National Guard and Reserve component issues.

Prior to this position, James served for 10 years on the professional staff of the House Armed Services Committee, one of the major Congressional committees with responsibility over the defense budget.

Upon leaving government, James joined United Technologies Corporation in 1998, where she was responsible for planning, coordination, and implementation of international marketing strategies for the sale of aerospace products; oversight and management of corporate sales offices overseas and liaison with government, industry and other entities at home.

In 2000, James served as the executive vice president and chief operating officer of the non-profit Business Executives for National Security (BENS). She was responsible for strategic planning and day-to-day management including policy, communications, fundraising, membership growth, and financial control. BENS focuses on two central policy concerns: defending the U.S. against homeland threats and making the Defense Department more efficient through outsourcing and best business practices.

James is a graduate of Columbia University and holds a master's degree in international affairs and a bachelor's degree in comparative studies from Duke University.
